We're grateful for technology like Zoom, Skype and conference calling capabilities that will help us maintain our sense of the diocesan and parish family. By now you'll have received the communication to say that we have closed the synod office and that we are to work remotely for the time being. In addition to these internal directions, we are now in receipt of wider protocols from the provincial and federal governments to help flatten the pandemic curve in Ontario. Close adherence to these messages is crucial; we as a diocesan family must do our part in protecting the most vulnerable among us as we monitor the COVID-19 situation.

Although the synod office has physically closed, arrangements have been made through our department directors to facilitate the smooth running of our day-to-day diocesan business as much as is possible during this time. Operations-specific protocols are being worked out and communicated to those who will need occasional access to Cathedral Place. I urge all our parishes to take similar steps. It is crucial that we do our part to slow down the transmission of this virus.
