Almighty and everlasting God,

who in your tender love towards the human race sent your Son our Saviour, Jesus Christ,

to take upon him our flesh and to suffer death upon the cross:

grant that we may follow the example of his patience and humility

and also be made partakers of his resurrection; through Jesus Christ your Son, Our Lord,

who is alive and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

All: Amen.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

A Reading from the Prophet Zechariah chapter 9 verses 9-12

Rejoice greatly, O daughter Zion!
Shout aloud, O daughter Jerusalem!
Lo, your king comes to you;
triumphant and victorious is he,
humble and riding on a donkey,
on a colt, the foal of a donkey.
He will cut off the chariot from Ephraim
and the warhorse from Jerusalem;
and the battle-bow shall be cut off,
and he shall command peace to the nations;
his dominion shall be from sea to sea,
and from the River to the ends of the earth.

As for you also, because of the blood of my covenant with you, I will set your prisoners free from the waterless pit.

Return to your stronghold, O prisoners of hope; today I declare that I will restore to you double.

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THE GOSPEL OF THE PALMS: Matthew 21.1-11

One: The Lord be with you.

All: And also with you.

One: Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, according to Saint Matthew.

All: Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

When they had come near Jerusalem and had reached Bethphage, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to me. If anyone says anything to you, just say this, "The Lord needs them." And he will send them immediately.' This took place to fulfil what had been spoken through the prophet, saying,

'Tell the daughter of Zion,

Look, your king is coming to you,

humble, and mounted on a donkey,

and on a colt, the foal of a donkey.'

The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them; they brought the donkey and the colt, and put their cloaks on them, and he sat on them. A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. The crowds that went ahead of him and that followed were shouting,

'Hosanna to the Son of David!

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!

Hosanna in the highest heaven!'

When he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was in turmoil, asking, 'Who is this?' The crowds were saying, 'This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth in Galilee.'

One: Limitless God, we pray for those for whom this time of physical distancing creates particular

challenges: for the addicted, for those living with disabilities who do not have access to their usual supports, for those living with depression and anxiety, for those who do not have systems of care and for whom loneliness weighs heavily upon the soul. Grant them your support, an awareness of

your presence and strength.

Lord in your mercy,

All: hear our prayer.

One: Divine physician, we pray for those who are sick, especially those being admitted to our hospitals or

quarantined at home with COVID-19. Bring them relief and healing, ease their fears and strengthen

and protect those who seek to care for them.

Lord in your mercy,

All: hear our prayer.

One: Compassionate one, we pray for students, and especially those who have special needs and learning

challenges and for educational assistants who seek to support them in new ways. For parents who try to support learning from home and teachers finding creative ways to communicate. We pray for children who miss their friends and most especially those children for whom home is not a happy or

safe place.

Lord in your mercy,

All: hear our prayer.

One: God of Justice, we continue to pray for those who show us the way of justice and peace in our

world. For the prophets who champion the needs of the most vulnerable, for those who seek to protect your creation and the species which are endangered, for those who speak truth to power. That as we follow Christ we may turn words to action and see your Kingdom come on earth as it is in

heaven.
