Mission to Seafarers Southern Ontario Volunteer Job Description Position: Host

Nature of the Position

This position offers practical, emotional and spiritual support to Seafarers.

Outline of Responsibilities

- Host and welcome seafarers to our Seafarers' Centre
- Offer telephone and internet facilities
- Respond to emergency calls for assistance
- Offer practical, emotional and spiritual support to seafarers
- As the face of the Mission to Seafarers Southern Ontario, the host is responsible for making the drop-in centre feel like a "home away from home" for seafarers.
- Make coffee and cookies available, manage the tuck counter, assist seafarers find resources such as churches, stores, theatre, etc.
- Engage in conversation with and be a friendly ear to people far from home and family
- Journal visits
- Provide practical support to crews
- Provide early intervention in critical incidents, stress management and trauma counselling by trained chaplains
- Work with industry and local government to ensure seafarers are not forgotten
- Assist with events
- Attend volunteer meetings and training events as required

Skills & Experience

- Ability to listen actively
- Good sense of humour
- Ability to interact with those from diverse cultures and backgrounds
- Ability to operate both independently and collaboratively
- Willingness to "pitch in" at all levels and in all activities
- Compassion and desire to help others
- Knowledge of Greater Hamilton Area
- Knowledge of Skype, Facetime, WiFi, telephone cards

Boundaries & Limitations

- A minimum of monthly meetings with volunteer coordinator
- Completion of safety training
