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bidders list and does all the tendering by a pre-determined date.			

11.	The architect then meets with the Building Committee to discuss bids and their experience, if any, with the companies. The Building Committee chooses and advises the Corporation who confirms the choice.
12.	Hold a vestry meeting to present the project scope, including the updated design plans and budget. Ask the Vestry for approval to fundraise for the project, if necessary; and to proceed with the plan as presented.
13.	Ask your Building Committee to advise the Bishop and the Secretary of Synod that the Vestry has granted these approvals, and send the plans and all supporting documentation. Synod Council will then receive all of this information and entertain the request regarding the approval of the project. If the request is turned down, the Building Committee will receive feedback from Synod Council and can rework the project from step 9.
	You must have the Bishop's written permissionfor the project before you can proceed with the project. If the Bishop approves your project, have the Building Committee ask the Corporation to advise the contractor to proceed with the project and have the Building Committee monitor the project.
14.	When the project is complete, the Building Committee submits a set of drawings and other relevant documentation to the diocesan archivist.
