... Excerpts from the Dean's Report to Vestry for the year 2013



... From the Stewardship Report to Vestry for the year 2013

"In past our Bishop Michael Bird announced a particular focus for the coming year on one of the petals of the Diocesan Vision including innovation, stewardship and works of justice. In 2013 however, he encouraged each of our parishes in the diocese to look to the very core of our Vision and to ask these questions: 'What does following Christ passionately look like for you in your life?" What would it look like for your congregation? What should it look like; what could it look like? What does following Christ passionately mean for us as Anglicans here and now?"

Those are important questions. For many at Christ's Church Cathedral those questions are answered to a large extent by our Cathedral's tag line: We are a place of community, compassion and hope".



HOW YOU CAN GIVE

If you are not already giving proportionally (i.e. a percentage of your income), we ask that you prayerfully consider doing so. If you have not filled in an Intention Card for 2014 please take a few minutes to do so as this assists our budgeting process and our cash flow as well as your financial planning.

You can give by Pre-Authorized Payments, through weekly envelopes, or by special gifts and memorials. Our preference is that you use the Pre-Authorized Giving method because this ensures the Cathedral has regular cash flow to sustain its operations all year long.

GIVING IN 2013

Total giving to the Cathedral prior to year-end adjustments was \$309,397 (includes Parishioner Weekly Giving, Open Collection, Bishopsgate, Dean's Discretionary, Choral Scholarships, Outreach, and Special Offerings) against a budget of \$324,162 for a shortfall of \$14,765.







BUILDING A GENEROUS CULTURE OF STEWARDSHIP

Christian Stewardship is about understanding that all we have is a gift from God, and that when we give to parish ministries we're giving back to God what is God's in the first place.

Many people say that they feel personally rewarded by committing to an intentional program of giving to the church. They say that their commitment to giving is a kind of spiritual discipline, like prayer and worship, that helps them feel closer to God, and more closely linked to this community, its work and ministries.

We're learning how to be stewards of God's great gifts; and about the kind of life where we're trusting God with all that we are. Good stewardship is about understanding our mission and ministry, being hospitable and welcoming, building community involvement, being specific about our needs, communicating our financial situation, and being the best we can be in providing quality music, preaching, liturgy, and education.

We encourage you to make a conscious effort to determine an appropriate level of giving in proportion to your income. The Proportional Giving Chart will help you to determine your proportional gift. If you are not already giving proportionally, we suggest you prayerfully consider giving two percent of your income to the Cathedral this year. That's a good place to start. If you are currently giving proportionally we hope you will consider increasing your percentage gift by 2% for 2014..

For your convenience you can give by Pre-Authorized Payments, through weekly envelopes, or by special gifts and memorials.

We keep accurate and confidential records of your contributions, and we'll send you periodic and annual statements to facilitate your tax preparation.

Through our shared commitment we will continue to be a place of community, compassion and hope. Your response has been extraordinarily positive and we look forward to your continuing support.



OUR INVESTMENTS IN MINISTRIES FOR 2013


Our investments in ministries for 2014 include salaries and benefits, music, property costs, administration and program, diocesan assessment, interest and bank charges, and various discretionary items.
