

Canada's 150th Anniversary logo!

Canadian students from across Canada were invited to create the official logo for the 150th anniversary of Confederation through a national design contest. Ariana Cuvin, a student at the University of Waterloo, created the winning design chosen from a field of over 300 eligible entries. The logo is composed of a series of diamonds arranged in the shape of the iconic maple leaf. The four diamonds at the base represent the four original provinces that formed Confederation in 1867: Ontario, Quebec, New Brunswick and Nova Scotia. Additional diamonds extend out from the base to create nine more points—in total representing the 13 provinces and territories.

Feast Day of St. Barnabas June 11, by Fr. Steinman

Barnabas was a Jewish Levite from Cyprus who became one of the earliest Christian disciples at Jerusalem. His original name was Joseph, but he was called Barnabas by the Apostles, that name being interpreted by St. Paul as "Son of Encouragement" (Acts 4:36.)

It was Barnabas who introduced St. Paul to the Apostles (Acts 9:27) and he was sent by them to inquire into the situation at Antioch, where Christianity was being introduced to the Gentiles (Acts 11:22). Barnabas then brought St. Paul from Tarsus to help him in the first missionary journey which followed (Acts 13 & 14), beginning with Cyprus. In this work Barnabas was originally the leader, though St. Paul very soon became the more prominent one.

At the Council of Jerusalem (*Acts 15*), Barnabas defended the claims of the gentile Christians and then returned to Antioch with St. Paul (*Acts 15:30*). Due to a dispute with St. Paul, over John Mark, the two parted company and Barnabas and John Mark returned to Cyprus (*Acts 15:39*).

Barnabas is the traditional founder of the Cypriot Church and legend asserts that he was martyred, by stoning, at Salamis in AD 61. According to another legend, Barnabas was one of the seventy (*Luke 10:1*) and to yet another legend, he was the founder of the Church at Milan and its first bishop. Barnabas has also been cited as the possible author of the Epistle to the Hebrews.

In some places, the Feast day of St. Barnabas is celebrated by a gala procession led by young children scattering rose petals.
