I have thoroughly enjoyed the conversations I have had with so many of you at the meetings that have been held and I hope to have an occasion to be together again soon, so that I may thank you once again in person. Please know that I and our Synod Office staff will continue to be here for you and will walk with you every step of the way.

You will continue to be in my prayers and I wish you every blessing in this Easter season as you experience the gift of resurrection joy.

#### The Mission team impresses us with their projects...

Innovation and a spirit of co-operation came together as the Mission Team, working with St. John's, Port Dalhousie, St. Columba and the YWCA Life Skills department, all agreed to join forces and help Start Me Up Niagara (SMUN) with their project to supply kits of free personal care products to the needy in this area.

During two meetings with the Rectors of both churches, the YWCA Life Skills director, and Susan Vendetti, Executive Director of SMUN, it was agreed that St. Barnabas would become the depot where personal care products are warehoused and distributed, on a scheduled basis, to the needy of our area. All groups would supply help to manage and operate this project. As of this writing, shelves have been assembled and erected in our basement. The shelving was donated. In addition, two lockable tote boxes have been donated for the storage of these products, but we'll need a few more. Can you help? Shortly, all participants will start collecting personal care products for distribution, items such as; toothbrushes, toothpaste, floss, shampoo, hairbrushes, combs, soap-bar and liquid, razors and shaving cream, body lotion and every other product imaginable to help keep your body clean and healthy.



The Mission Team, as part of its mandate, has been evaluating various ways to further enhance its mission within the Greater St. Catharines Group and community, and as a result it is planning a Community Garden out back (behind the old rectory) with homeless and needy locals growing both flowers and vegetables for their use. And further it is working closely with SMUN, to use **our** kitchen for training and certification of locals in food handling, as well as starting basic cooking classes for the untrained.

Watch for more information in future newsletters on the startup of these fabulous projects that are all now in the initial planning stages with the Mission Team.
