## **Message from the Interim Pastor**



## The Reverend Canon Dr. Cathie Crawford Browning

We live in a world in which so many people do not go to church. When the topic comes up that we do, the question we are asked is often 'why?' If we hesitate or seem unsure ourselves, our witness is not very compelling. If, however, we've given this some deliberate thought, we can be an encouragement to others who would be blessed to participate in a Christian community.

Here are my 10 reasons for living out my faith in the church:

1. It is in weekly worship that I am most vividly reminded of what my life is to be centered upon throughout the rest of the week: God. If I didn't worship on a regular basis, I expect that God would be at the periphery, rather than front and center, of my values, priorities and concerns in my daily living.

2. This is the place where I read and study Scripture. If it were not for my involvement in the church, I'm not sure that I would ever read or hear any of the stories of the working of God in the world in the past that help me to know how to recognize God at work in the world in the present.

3. This is the only place where I get to SING my praises to God. Where else would I find myself lost in the joyous wonder of singing (with other people who will put up with me!) 'How Great Thou Art' or 'Praise to the Lord, the Almighty'?

4. This is the community in which I am physically fed with the body and blood of Christ so that my body and soul are nourished by Jesus.

5. It is in the church that I get to spend time with others who have dedicated their hearts and minds to living as servants of Jesus Christ—the place where I have friends who are 'like-minded' in terms of their morals and commitments.

6. This is the community that is focused on learning and growing in Christ—the place where I get to spend time listening and praying and studying with others so that I can come to know God more fully.

7. Church is the community which functions as the 'Body of Christ', filled with those who are committed to serving as Jesus' eyes and mouth and hands and feet—who use their time and energy to bring His love and care to people on earth. 8. This is the place where I am reminded about how God feels about me—that I am loved, treasured, wanted, forgiven, called, challenged by the One is nothing less than the Creator and Sustainer of the universe.

9. Church is the community in which I am reminded of the messages that the secular world such as consumerism, materialism, hedonism; that only rich, famous, beautiful, powerful people matter; that looking after my own needs and wants is all that is important — can all be challenged and corrected by the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

10. While I pray that I often know the presence of Jesus in my life, the church is the one place where I am guaranteed to meet Him—recall He promised that where two or three are gathered in His name, He is in their midst.
