Following the direction of Bishop Susan, our facilities remain closed to keep everyone safe during the summer months. It is our hope that we will open again after Labour Day with many safety protocols in place. But we await future recommendations of Public Health authorities and

the Diocesan Office before we make concrete plans to re-open for in-person worship. Our St. John's Pandemic Committee will meet when more specific regulations are available and we will share the official announcement of our re-opening with you later in August.

Until we can meet in person, continue to join the many followers of our **St. John's Port Dalhousie Facebook** devotions that are posted at 9 a.m. each Sunday morning. Did you miss any? Every posting since Holy Week is on our Facebook page! We are so blessed that Father Bruce, with the wonderful assistance of his wife Suzanne, provide us these exceptional short but moving and inspirational on-line services. We predict that even with eventual re-opening and return to our in-person worship that on-line devotions will continue to be part of our new normal. They allow our members who are unable to leave home and friends living far away to join us in worship.

Despite the restrictions of this Covid 19 Pandemic, Outreach continues. Sincere thanks for the incredible support of our parishioners and the citizens of Port

Dalhousie who contributed to our "Fill The Trailer" Food Drive for Community Care. In four hours on June 10, we collected eight brimming barrels of food and supplies and \$1115 in donations to help those in need. The Community Care truck driver was so moved and amazed by the generosity of our community. Local folks thanked St. John's throughout the day for providing a safe way for them to help



out. Our BWC partners and the Port Legion helped us spread the word. Be prepared! We plan to have another Food Drive near the end of August. Our doors may be closed, but our work continues!



You might have noticed an attractive shed arising behind the church. St. John's is providing Port Dalhousie's Beautification and Works Committee (BWC) at their expense a place to store all their gardening equipment they use to beautify our downtown core and park spaces at the entrance of the town. This is part of our church's mission to partner with local groups and to maintain our role as a meaningful hub in the community.

Due to the devotion of so many parishioners, regular offerings have remained constant despite the closing of our facilities! Enclosed you will find your half year report of offerings. We are still feeling the impact of loss revenue from hall rentals, poor performance of investments, and cancelled fundraising. But we have much to be grateful for. Steady parishioner offerings, a diocesan interest free loan, reduced staffing and expenses, and support from the federal government for non-profit groups (CEWS) allow us to pay our bills

and keep afloat. *Thank you* for your critical financial support. Once again, we have supplied a self-addressed stamped envelope for your convenience. (If you don't use these envelopes, save and return them later to help us save money.) During this unusual time, we thank our phone callers, gardeners, our caretaker Rudy, and Parish Council members who continue their work on Zoom.

Please keep us informed of parishioners who need our prayers and support. We are all missing each other. And when the fall returns, we will reveal our creativity and passion to resume in some form or another the various groups and ministries that enrich our personal lives, support our parish, and help others.
